

## Unicorn Pattern – magical creatures by 3vorDrei.wordpress.com

Well, you probably cannot tell at first sight, but the unicorn is closely related to another magical creature: the dragon. Body and head are therefore quite similar to my dragon pattern. Check it out aswell!

### The Head

Round 1: 6 sc into the magic circle

Round 2: 2 sc in every sc (12 sc in round)

Round 3: 1 sc in first sc, 2 sc in the next sc, repeat until the end of the round (18)

Round 4 : 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat until the end of the round (24)

Round 5: 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat until the end of the round (30)

Round 6: 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat until the end of the round (36)

Round 7: 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat until the end of the round (42)

Round 8.-12: 1 sc in every sc

Round 12: 5 sc, decrease, repeat until the end of the round (36)

Round 13: 4 sc, decrease, repeat until the end of the round (30)

Round 14: 3 sc, decrease, repeat until the end of the round (24)

Round 15: 2 sc, decrease, repeat until the end of the round (18)

Round 16: 1 sc, , decrease, repeat until the end of the round (12)

Continue with the body ...

Round 17: 1 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat until the end of the round (18)

Round 18: 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat until the end of the round (24)

Round 19: 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat until the end of the round (30)

Round 20-23: 1 sc in every sc

Round 24: 3 sc, decrease, repeat until the end of the round (24)

Round 25: 2 sc, decrease, repeat until the end of the round (18)

Round 26: 1 sc, decrease, repeat until the end of the round (12)

(This is a good time to stuff the unicorn)

Round 27: decrease every sc, finish off and sew the thread.

### The Muzzle

Round 1: 6 sc in magic circle

Round 2: 2 sc in every sc (12 sc)

Round 3: 1 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat until the end of the round (18 sc)

Round 4: 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc (24 sc)

Runde 5-9: 1 sc in every sc (24 sc)

Sew on the nostrils, stuff the muzzle and attach it to the body.

## Legs and hooves

Captain Obvious: Make 4 legs. Now to the less obvious part: Start with the hooves in a colour of your choice.

Round 1: 5 sc in magic circle

Round 2: 2 sc in every sc (10 sc)

Round 3. - 5. Reihe: 1 sc in every sc (10 sc).

At the end of round 5 change to the colour of the body.

Round 6: decrease two sc in this round (8 sc)

Round 7. - 12. Reihe: 1 sc in every sc

Finish off and stuff the legs.

## The Horn

The horn is a bit tricky, since it is very tight in the beginning. That's why we're not using a magic circle.

Chain 3 and close the circle with a slip stitch

Round 1: crochet 3 sc into the ring

Round 2: 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc (4 sc)

Round 3- 8: increase 1 sc per round

Make the horn as big as you like, finish off, stuff it and sew it onto the head.

## The Ears

crochet in rows, not in rounds – make 2

Row1: chain 5 , turn, 4 sc, turn without a chain,

Row 2: 3 sc, turn with a chain,

Row 3: 3 sc, turn without chain

Row 4: 2 sc, turn without chain

Row 5: 1 sc, finish off and sew the thread

## Mane and tail

Up to the fun part! Cut off as many strings of colored yarn as you like. My strings were about 15 cm long. Fold the yarn over and put the loop through your sewing needle. Attach the string to the head of the unicorn by pulling the needle and the loop through the head and pulling the leftover yarn through the loop. There you go – you've just made a knot :D. Attach as much hair as you like.

For the tail you make a tassel of yarn. Therefore, fold a bundle of yarn in half and fixate the middle with a knot. Now you can sew the tail to the body. Wrap the remaining strand of yarn around the tail, knot again and let the remaining strand go into the tail aswell – you're done!

Have fun with your magical unicorn!
